Anmerkung zum Konzert mit Ukrainischer Musik

The concert program, presented by Anton Kushnir (flute) and Maria Pukhlianko (piano), consists of works by Ukrainian composers. These works were written in different eras and in different styles, and this is not accidental.

The goal of this program is to present the flute repertoire of various composers, not only those who were born in Ukraine, but also those who lived in Ukraine or were related to this country.

Maksym Berezovsky (Ukraine–Italy, 1745–1777) is a composer of the second half of the 18th century. Received professional education in Bologna (Italy), played the violin. The work presented in this program is a transcription of “Grave” from his violin sonata.

Franz Xaver Mozart (Austria–Ukraine, 1791–1844). Famous Doppler brothers, virtuoso flutists, composers and ethnic Hungarians, were born, lived and worked for a long time in the Austro-Hungarian city of Lviv (Lemberg). This Ukrainian city is also known for the fact that Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's son Franz Xaver Mozart, also a composer, pianist and teacher, lived there for about 30 years. “Rondo” is the first part of unfinished flute sonata, which was written during his stay in Ukraine, approximately in 1826.

Serhiy Bortkewycz (Ukraine–Germany–Austria, 1877–1952) is a Ukrainian pianist and composer who was born in Kharkiv and studied at the Leipzig Conservatory. For many years lived in Germany, then lived and died in Austria .

George Gershwin (USA, 1898–1937) is an American composer. He was born in New York at Jewish immigrants family from Ukraine (his father was from Odesa).

Myroslav Skoryk (Ukraine, 1938–2020) famous composer of the late 20th-early 21st century, musicologist, conductor, pianist, pedagogue. Professor at the Kyiv and Lviv academies of music at the same time. Artistic director of the festival "Kyiv Music Fest", member of the jury of many music competitions, author of the music for the famous film "Shadows of Forgotten Ancestors". One of the brightest figures of the Ukrainian school of composers of the 20-21st centuries.
